ST HELENS BOROUGH AFGHANISTAN APPEAL

With St Helens Borough Council playing its part in the resettlement of Afghan refugees, the local authority is working with community groups and charities to coordinate a local response to support those in need.

Together with Our Warm Welcome, a St Helens-based charity which supports asylum seekers and refugees in the local community, St Helens Library Service is now accepting food, toiletries, and household cleaning products at all of its 12 sites, in addition to the work carried out for St Helens Food Bank. Meanwhile, a text service for residents wishing to donate money has been launched and newly bought sealed clothing or household items can be dropped off at various locations to support Afghan communities resettling in the borough over the coming months.

MAJOR BROWNFIELD REGENERATION PROJECT UNDERWAY

Work to transform a derelict brownfield site in Sutton into a new neighbourhood with high quality homes, open spaces and sports pitches is under way. A striking sculpture at the entrance gateway is one of the visible signs that work is progressing on the 95-acre site, which has capacity to deliver up to 900 homes. Remediation activity and infrastructure provision is also now well-advanced to support delivery of the initial 258 homes by Taylor Wimpey, plans for which were approved by St Helens Borough Council's Planning Committee earlier this year.

Harworth have assembled the site, which will include a boulevard spine road lined with grass and mature trees, with provision for public transport and segregated pedestrian and cycle routes alongside a network of public open spaces with high quality landscaping and play areas. This is another example of St Helens Borough Council proactively engaging with developers to help bring brownfield sites back into use as attractive places to live.

GAMBLE RESTORATION TO BEGIN

Work to restore one of St Helens Borough's most iconic landmark buildings will get underway next month (October), the council has confirmed. With a contractor now in place, £1.4m of repairs will be carried out to the Gamble Institute in Victoria Square which has been closed to the public since 2017 due to structural issues caused by water damage making the lower levels of the building unsafe.
